| Objective (s) | Children to experience and spread the joy of reading. To raise the profile of reading within the community |

| Setting, materials, and preparation | Setting: school and home of disadvantaged children, adults or seniors |
| | Materials needed: A selection of interesting books |
| Step-by-step description | The volunteer reads the whole book first. Teachers/ Librarians listen to volunteer's reading aloud and check the volunteer's reading skills. They make corrections or give tips. They also talk with the volunteer about the person who s/he will be reading to. The teacher/ librarian presents the volunteer to the disabled child, adult or senior and accompany him/her during the first meeting. Teacher/ Librarian monitors the choice of books and the cooperation between the volunteer and the disadvantaged person. |
| Notes to reading promotion facilitator | It is very important to choose the appropriate volunteer for the chosen disabled child, adult or |







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| | senior. • The volunteer should be mentally prepared and know the situation of the disadvantaged person very well. |
| Suggested follow-up actions/ activities | The volunteer can also become a source of information to the disadvantaged person, about library resources, not only traditional, but multimedia too (for example the audio-books). |
