Objective (s)	 To motivate and inspire families to read at home and encourage their boys to do so too. To improve boys' reading habits and behaviour, by providing positive male role models.
Age level (s)	6-12
Preferable number of participants	All students and families
Duration	1 day
Setting, materials, and preparation	Setting: All school premises
Step -by-step description	 For World Book Day the school holds a "Bring a Man to School Day." Students bring their dad, uncle, granddad or brother along with their favourite book. A series of reading-related activities take place during the day, including DEAR "Drop Everything And Read" (when a pre-agreed signal is given, everyone drops what they are doing and start reading).
Notes to reading promotion facilitator	 This kind of action works best when it is organised by the boys themselves.
Suggested follow-up actions/ activities	 Instead of having all students' male family members visit the school on the same day, each student could arrange a visit by a male family member on separate days.
