Objective (s)	 Children to interact within reading communities, playing, communicating, and discussing book- and reading-related issues. Children to develop book-selecting strategies; to be able to make and justify a selection. Children to come in touch with a big volume of texts.

Preferable number of participants	 One or more classes from the same school Or more than one schools 	
Duration	• 1-3 months	
Setting, materials, and preparation	 Place: Classroom, library, or elsewhere Materials: books from home or the library, magazines featuring book reviews, websites, announcements and reasoning for literary awards. 	
Step -by-step description	 The idea is for children to vote and give an award to a favourite book/ author/ illustrator. This can be a special award (e.g. "Funniest Book of the Year Award," "Best Science Fiction Award," "Best Non-Fiction book of the Year," "Best Illustration Award," etc.) but it may also be more general. Children collaborate with school staff to set the award's theme and criteria. It is useful to study magazines featuring book reviews, websites with announcements and reasoning for literary awards,
