Objective (s)	<ul> <li>Children to view themselves as readers.</li> <li>To engage children in reading for pleasure and enhance their reading habits.</li> <li>To develop reading communities and enhance the school's reading culture.</li> </ul>

Duration	4 - 6 week period	
Setting, materials, and preparation	Setting: at home/in the classroom/library Materials: Suitable, age-appropriate reading materials and Reading record	
	Preparation: Designate a coordinator of Readathon and inform parents of initiative	
Step -by-step description	<ul> <li>Participants read as many books as they can within the 4-6 week period and record them in their Reading Record.</li> <li>Parents and school staff also read and record as many books as they can.</li> <li>Children are given the opportunity to select their own books to read.</li> <li>Organisations and companies aid Readathon by using</li> </ul>	



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	<ul> <li>initiatives such as DEAR (Drop Everything and Read), paired reading and book clubs. Employees read as many books as they can.</li> <li>The total count of books read during the Readathon is announced during a whole-school celebration.</li> <li>If sponsors are available, then a preset amount is donated to the school or to charity for each book read.</li> </ul>
Notes to reading promotion facilitator	<ul> <li>Encourage children to read for enjoyment.</li> <li>The teacher also reads at the allocated time as a role model for children.</li> <li>Motivate children to develop their reading skills.</li> <li>All children are involved as the books chosen suit the reader.</li> </ul>
Suggested follow-up actions/ activities	<ul> <li>Organisations supporting Readathon may wish to set up book clubs or organize projects around children's reading.</li> </ul>
