Objective (s)	 Children to view themselves as readers. To engage children in reading for pleasure and enhance their reading habits. To develop reading communities and enhance the school's reading culture. 	
Age level (s)	7 - 14	
Preferable number of participants	All children, staff, parents and the wider community	
Duration	4 - 6 week period	
Setting, materials, and preparation	Setting: at home/in the classroom/library Materials: Suitable, age-appropriate reading materials and Reading record	
	Preparation: Designate a coordinator of Readathon and inform parents of initiative	
Step -by-step description	 Participants read as many books as they can within the 4-6 week period and record them in their Reading Record. Parents and school staff also read and record as many books as they can. Children are given the opportunity to select their own books to read. Organisations and companies aid Readathon by using 	



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	 initiatives such as DEAR (Drop Everything and Read), paired reading and book clubs. Employees read as many books as they can. The total count of books read during the Readathon is announced during a whole-school celebration. If sponsors are available, then a preset amount is donated to the school or to charity for each book read.
Notes to reading promotion facilitator	 Encourage children to read for enjoyment. The teacher also reads at the allocated time as a role model for children. Motivate children to develop their reading skills. All children are involved as the books chosen suit the reader.
Suggested follow-up actions/ activities	 Organisations supporting Readathon may wish to set up book clubs or organize projects around children's reading.
